APRIL 19, 2011

#1....THE REGULAR MEETING of the City Council of the City of Danville was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer.

THE ROLL CALL was answered by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer, Vice Mayor Rick Strebing, Aldermen Jerry Askren, Terry Baldwin, Ron Candido, Jon Cooper, Lois Cooper, Steve Foster, Bill Gilbert, Sharon McMahon, Steve Nichols, Michael Puhr, and DeMarko Wright. Absent were Aldermen Dale Brandenburg and Rickey Williams, Jr. A quorum was present.

#4....THE MINUTES of the special meeting held March 24, 2011, and the regular meeting held April 5, 2011, both having been published and distributed, were presented by Mayor Eisenhauer.

#6-B..Board/Committee Appointments

Mayor Eisenhauer asked for concurrence to re-appoint Martha Yusko as Trustee to the Fireman's Pension Board, term to expire 04/2014, and Janet Myers as Trustee to the Police Pension Board, term to expire 05/2013. Vice Mayor Strebing moved to concur, seconded by Alderman J.Cooper. There being no discussion, on the voice vote, all ayes, no nays; the motion so ordered.

#6-D-1..Celebrity Way Committee Recommendations

Mayor Eisenhauer announced recommendations by the Celebrity Way Committee to place signs honoring Reginald Weaver along Jackson Street near Danville High School and Irving Azoff along East Main Street near Danville Area Community College. Alderman Baldwin moved to concur,

seconded by Alderman Foster. Reginald Weaver is an outspoken advocate for public education and one of the country's foremost African American labor leaders. He is a 30 year classroom veteran and native of Danville, and has received many honors and award. Irving Azoff is an American personal manager, representing many famous recording artists in the music industry, is chairman and founder of Azoff Music Management Group, and chairman and CEO of Ticketmaster Entertainment. Both attended Danville High School and were named to the school's Wall of Fame. Mayor Eisenhower stated that once signs have been received, a date will be announced as to when they will be placed, along with a ceremony honoring these gentlemen. #11...Presentation of Budget for Fiscal Year 2011-2012

Mayor Eisenhauer presented the Budget for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 totaling \$43,425,074.00 and stated the only change in what was presented earlier and the final version is the addition of line item numbers for those newly created line items. Alderman Candido moved for approval, seconded by Vice Mayor Strebing. Alderman Nichols voiced approval of the balanced budget and how Mayor Eisenhauer has always used current revenue figures as projected revenues. However, his concerns are that citizens are taxed too much from all taxing bodies; therefore, he will vote "no" and asked for ways to give money back to the taxpayers. Alderman Puhr stated he will vote to support the budget and stated that a constituent contacted him with appreciation for the way the Council has diversified revenues in order to get revenue from more than just property owners and Danville residents, such as gasoline and sales taxes. Alderman Candido voiced support as well and suggested the federal and state government collect from the 40% of the people who are on welfare and do not pay any federal income tax. There being no further comments or questions, the roll call vote being:

Alderman Gilbert questioned the streets for the overlay and if anything was being done South of Voorhees Street. It was clarified that this project is for overlay on sections of North Gilbert, Conron, Dodge, Lake Terrace Drive, and Park Haven Boulevard, but that other streets are scheduled for improvements through other methods such as micro surfacing or sealcoat, with many South of Voorhees. It was stated that due to the late billing on the part of AmerenIP, the City was able to negotiate a reduced cost. Alderman McMahon voiced objection of the work being done in 2006 but not invoiced until 2010 and stated she would vote "no". There being no further discussion, the roll call vote being:

Comptroller Lewis also presented the General Fund Cash Flow Report as of April 19, 2011, and stated State and City Sales Tax and Corporate Replacement Tax revenues have been received. The PSB Rebate is expected soon but funds from the State for the IKOMAT Project expected in April will not be received until May. All proposed budget amendments have been included in the Cash Flow Report; however, there is one more Payroll and one more Schedule of Vouchers Payable that will be paid out before the end of the month. #12-FF..Chairman Puhr presented ORDINANCE NO. 8736 amending Chapter 116.13 Taxation to require that 4% of the total proceeds from City Home Rule Municipal Tax revenue be distributed to the Infrastructure Improvement Fund budget line item Economic Development in order to cash flow the Line of Credit for the North Vermilion Development Project on property formerly named K's Merchandise and for future development projects, moved to dispense with the reading and asked for approval as discussed and forwarded by Committee, seconded by Vice Mayor Strebing. Alderman McMahon questioned how soon these funds would begin to be received and if the company is coming for sure. Comptroller Lewis stated the ordinance becomes effective May 1, 2012. Mayor Eisenhower clarified that \$222,000.00 has already been moved to the Economic Development line item to cover the first year payment on the loan, with the next four annual payments being taken from the revenue generated from the extra sales tax going into this Fund. He then clarified that the "Letter of Intent" with the developer, while not legally binding, gives some indication of community support of the project and the Development Agreement is what spells out details, which will be presented on May 3, 2011, for a vote by the Council. To address Alderman Candido's question as to using sales tax revenue from this particular retailer to pay back the loan, Mayor Eisenhower stated the 4% was based upon this retailer's projected sales, which happens to be equal to 4% of what the City's total sales tax receipts are now on an annual basis. The additional sales tax revenue that will be generated from other businesses locating in Danville will also increase the amount of dollars going into this Fund. After the loan is paid off, those dollars will continue to accumulate and be used for other future development projects. At any time in the future, the City Council would have the opportunity to transfer funds into other areas or change the ordinance to amend the percentage, as well as reduce the local sales tax rate to offer relief to the citizens. Alderman Williams voiced support of earmarking funds for economic development projects but suggested putting 4% of the current sales tax revenue into the Fund now to start saving for future development, then use the additional 4% of new sales tax generated from the project to pay off the loan. He also suggested language to require that the loan be paid off first before any of the funds can be used for any other development. Mayor Eisenhower stated an amendment could be made to this ordinance with specific language but that is the intent of this action to pay off the loan first. Alderman Askren questioned the term of the loan and it was stated the \$1.2 million line of credit will be paid off in five years. To address Alderman Foster's question, money will be drawn down only when needed. There being no further questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:

- City Engineer Schnelle announced the final Public Hearing on the Beltline will be Wednesday, May 4, 2011. A press release will be issued soon.
- Alderman Foster suggested another round of Ward Meetings in June so that residents have an opportunity to meet the new Aldermen.
