DECEMBER 20, 2011

#1...THE REGULAR MEETING of the City Council of the City of Danville was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer.

THE ROLL CALL was answered by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer, Vice Mayor Rick Strebing, Aldermen Jon Cooper, Steve Foster, April Gilbert, Bill Gilbert, Sharon McMahon, Steve Nichols, Michael O'Kane, Michael Puhr, and Thomas Stone. Absent were Aldermen Bill Black, Lois Cooper, Kevin Davis, and Rickey Williams, Jr. A quorum was present. Alderman Williams arrived at 6:07 p.m. and Alderman Black arrived at 6:08 p.m.

#4...THE MINUTES of the regular meeting held December 6, 2011, having been published and distributed, were presented. Alderman B.Gilbert moved for approval, seconded by Alderman Puhr. On the voice vote, the ayes carried; motion so ordered.

#5...THE AGENDA for the evening was presented with Mayor Eisenhauer moving Items #12-M & N to #12-A & B, with remaining items being moved down. Vice Mayor Strebing moved for approval as amended, seconded by Alderman B.Gilbert. On the voice vote, all ayes, no nays; the motion so ordered.

#10...SCHEDULE OF VOUCHERS PAYABLE

Mayor Eisenhauer presented the Schedule of Vouchers Payable, each having been published, posted, and distributed, for December 13, 2022, of \$1,225,883.73 and December 20, 2011, of \$678,765.71. Alderman Foster moved to dispense with the readings and asked for approval as presented, seconded by Vice Mayor Strebing. Questions by Alderman Black regarding certain payments were addressed, as follows:

- Payment of over \$41,000.00 to Ameren is the monthly amount for various services. It was clarified that Constellation is the energy supplier, with Ameren as the distributor.
- Payment of \$1,794.0 to Verizon is the current monthly amount, down from previous amounts due to several cellular phones being eliminated.
- Tires are purchased from Watson General Tire through the State Contract and due to having good service.
- The worth of a 1998 Plymouth Breeze was questioned compared to the \$1,900.00 repair made.
- Travel expense of \$245.14 was paid to FIA Card Services for the City Treasurer to attend the Annual Treasurer’s Institute in Bloomington.
- Staff is reimbursed when setting up the large inflatable movie screen, which is used by various other communities and organizations.
- Kerosene is purchased for use in approved space heaters when work is being done in buildings with no heat, such as Danville Stadium or the Parks Garage.

#11...TAX LEVY DOCUMENTS AND SPECIAL SERVICE AREA #1 BUDGET

#11-A..Mayor Eisenhauer presented ORDINANCE NO. 8766 approving the 2011 Tax Levy of \$6,492,974.00 a decrease of 3.89% over last year, assuming an Equalized Assessed Value of \$328,970.00 for an estimated Tax Rate of \$1.9737, a decrease of .04% over last year. Vice Mayor Strebing moved to dispense with the reading and asked for approval, seconded by Alderman Puhr.

To address Alderman Black's question regarding funding for the interest and principal payment, it was clarified that when the Bonds were set up, it was indicated that payment of the debt obligations would come from funds out of the Sanitary Sewer Fund instead of the Tax Levy. #11-F..Mayor Eisenhauer presented ORDINANCE NO. 8771 abating a portion of the 2011 Tax Levy for Series 2011 General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$368,697.06 from the General Fund.

Alderman Stone moved to dispense with the reading and asked for approval, seconded by Alderman Puhr. To address Alderman Black's questions regarding what this action implies, it was clarified that

funds will be taken out of the General Fund budget to pay the principal and interest due on the Bonds instead of out of the property tax; thereby reducing the amount of tax being levied and keeping the tax rate under \$2.00, while reducing the amount that could have been spent for General Fund operations. It was also stated that an extra \$175,000.00 from the General Fund was added to the abatement amount during the last Council meeting after Vermilion County Supervisor of Assessment Matt Long suggested a 4% decrease in the EAV (Equalized Assessed Value) instead of the City's projected 2% decrease. Aldermen Nichols, Puhr, and Foster voiced support of abating the Tax Levy with General Fund dollars in order to keep the Tax Rate low. There being no further questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:

#12-H..Chairman Puhr presented RESOLUTION NO. 2011-145 awarding Bid #472 for Municipal Building Flooring Installation Project to lowest responsible bidder Precision Floor & Tile, Inc. of Urbana, Illinois, for first and second floors only for an amount of \$39,934.00, to come from Capital Improvement Fund line item Other Improvements and the 2009 Bond Issue Fund line item Municipal Building Renovations, moved to dispense with the reading and asked for approval as recommended by Committee, seconded by Alderman Black. It was clarified that although the bid included the lower level of City Hall for \$19,181.00, the recommendation is to proceed with only the first floor at \$21,037.00 and the second floor at \$18,897.00. Alderman Foster stated that the project was rebid a second time due to the need to separate the cost for each floor. Since the resolution document presented stated the total bid amount of \$59,115.00, Alderman Black moved to correct the amount to read \$39,934.00, seconded by Alderman B.Gilbert. There being no discussion on the amendment, on the voice vote, all ayes, no nays; the motion so ordered. During further discussion, it was stated that the initial intent was to pay for the project out of the 2009 Bond; however, timing may prevent that from happening due to having to rebid the project. There being no further questions or discussion on the resolution as amended, the roll call vote being:

#12-I..Chairman Puhr presented RESOLUTION NO. 2011-146 waiving bid procedures due to the need to rebid the project, awarding Bid #470 for Walnut Street Parking Garage Improvement Project to sole bidder English Brothers Company in the amount of \$158,547.30, to come 2009 Bond Issue Fund line item Parking Lots/Structures, and authorizing a Budget Amendment in the 2009 Bond Issue Fund to increase line item Parking Lot/Structures by \$160,000.00, to come from the 2009 Bond Issue Reserve, moved to dispense with the reading and asked for approval as recommended by Committee, seconded by Vice Mayor Strebing. There being no questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:

#12-K..RESOLUTION NO. 2011-148 approving additional Sanitary Sewer Repairs on the North/South Sewer West of Gilbert Street near Wilkin Road and increasing the Purchase Order to Cross Construction an additional amount of \$2,254.35 for a total contract of \$22,337.35, to come from Sanitary Sewer Department Fund line item Maintenance of Sanitary Sewers;

Alderman Stone questioned what item was discovered during the sanitary sewer repairs and it was stated a manhole was buried and needed removed. To address Alderman Black's questions regarding the Westwood Project, it was stated that the elevation difference does not allow for a sewer to be installed at the end of Westwood; however, there is the ability to tap into the new sewer with a private lift station paid for by the owner of the property. The property at the end currently is on a septic system and although it is unknown how that was allowed to be installed, it would be grandfathered in at this time. City Engineer Schnelle stated the property owner would benefit by the Overhead Sewer Program being proposed as the next item. He also stated some of the deteriorated sections of English Street will be addressed with this project. There being no further questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:

It was clarified that this would be a voluntary program for property owners to be able to come into compliance with current Codes, if desired, and to share in the cost with the City and Danville Sanitary District.

Alderman Foster questioned a "sunset clause" and it was stated there was none. There being no further questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:

#12-N..ORDINANCE NO. 8778 amending Chapter 77, Schedule V, to prohibit parking on both sides of Oakwood Avenue from the North/South alley East of Avenue A to the Ellsworth Park Entrance at all times;


