DECEMBER 15, 2015

#1....THE REGULAR MEETING of the City Council of the City of Danville was called to order at 6:25 p.m. by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer after the Special City Council Meeting.

THE ROLL CALL was answered by Mayor Scott Eisenhauer, Vice Mayor Rickey Williams, Jr., Aldermen Brenda Brown, Jon Cooper, R.J. Davis, Steve Foster, Frank Hoskins, Sharon McMahon, Steve Nichols, Sherry Pickering, Michael O’Kane, Michael Puhr, Lloyd Randle, and Rick Strebing. A quorum was present. Absent was Alderman Tom Stone.

#4....THE MINUTES of the regular meeting held, December 1, 2015, having been published and distributed, were presented. Alderman Cooper moved for approval as presented, seconded by Alderman Puhr. On the voice vote, the motion so ordered.

#5....THE AGENDA for the evening was presented. There being no changes, Alderman Strebing moved for approval as presented, seconded by Alderman Cooper. On the voice vote, all ayes, no nays; the motion so ordered.

#6-C-1) Danville Election Commission Update

Danville Election Commission Director Will Nesbitt updated the Council on how technology will change the voting process; however, paper ballots will still be used in the March primary election. The Commission is trying five new tabulating machines which will transition to a system called Express Vote which should be up and running within the next two years. Software has been received to help with graphs and charts for election night. He also stated March will be the first election to have same day voter registration which will be challenging. The office workload has tripled due to new laws with address changes when notification is received from the post office. Director Nesbitt also announced the need for election judges.

- Mayor Eisenhauer wished a “Happy Birthday” to Public Transportation Director Lisa Beith who recently celebrated a birthday.
- Mayor Eisenhauer conveyed condolences to Dick Brazda at the recent passing of his mother.

- The City Christmas Luncheon will be held Friday, December 18 at 12:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Mayor Eisenhower encouraged Council members to attend.
- Policemen's Benevolent & Protective Association Unit 11 (PB&PA #11) is serving meals during the holiday season to seniors housed at senior residence centers throughout the City. Mayor Eisenhower applauded the Police union for providing the meals and announced the last meal will be served at CRIS Senior Services on December 17 when he will assist the Police union members serve the meal.
- Mayor Eisenhower announced he will contact the media and Aldermen by December 18 if the Public Services Committee meeting set for December 22 will be cancelled.
- Riverfront Presentation boards will be hung in the hallway on the second floor of City Hall so everyone has a chance to see them during normal business hours.
- Assistant Corporation Counsel Bethany Nystrom was welcomed by Mayor Eisenhower as she was filling in for Corporation Counsel Dave Wesner.
- Mayor Eisenhower recognized audience members Jan and Cyril Ostiguy for their Christmas costume attire and wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

#7...PETITIONS, COMMUNICATIONS, AUDIENCE COMMENTS

- Jan Ostiguy of Danville stated she is very proud of the Aldermen who asked questions regarding the DHS Shared Use Path Improvement Project. She still has questions and concerns about the project and is not so sure the roundabout is necessary as there are not even sidewalks on many streets north of Danville High School and many streets in the City need fixed. She also stated hospital employees who navigate the medians near the hospital are concerned because drivers still do not stop when they are crossing the street.
- Cyril Ostiguy of Danville spoke regarding the Jackson at Orchard Street sewer repair and is keeping his fingers crossed the repair will help with the sewer problems at his home. He also stated to use the roundabout at English and Jackson as an experiment before one is placed at Voorhees Street.

#8...ZONING PETITIONS

Mayor Eisenhower presented Items A through B for a single vote, moved to dispense with the readings and asked for approval. There being no objections, Alderman Davis moved to concur with the recommendations and asked for approval, seconded by Alderman Hoskins.

#8-A... Zoning Petition #247, ORDINANCE NO. 9014, amending the Zoning Ordinance and Map to rezone 606 Warrington Avenue and 632 Warrington Avenue from R2 and B1 respectively to R4 Multi-Family Residential to allow for the expansion of onsite parking and construction of an addition onto the existing nursing home facility at 620 Warrington Avenue for Petitioner Colonial Manor. After hearing testimony during a Public Hearing on December 3, 2015, the Planning & Zoning Commission voted 7 to 0 with 2 absent to recommend approval.

#8-B... Planned Unit Development #15-01, ORDINANCE NO. 9015, amending the Zoning Ordinance and Map for Petitioner Colonial Manor for their existing nursing home property and adjacent lots which are commonly referred to as 620 Warrington Avenue for the purpose of consolidating the lots and the construction of an addition and expansion of onsite parking. Alderman Strebing stated residents want to make sure vehicle headlights in the parking lot are obstructed with buffering.

After hearing testimony during a Public Hearing on December 3, 2015, the Planning & Zoning Commission voted 7 to 0 with 2 absent to recommend approval. After all questions were addressed, the roll call vote being:

#8-C..Mayor Eisenhauer presented Rezoning Petition #248, ORDINANCE NO. 9016, Amending the Zoning Ordinance and Map to change the zoning commonly known as 208 Forrest Street and 215 S. Gilbert Street from R2 Single Family Residential classification to B2 Highway Business to allow for the expansion of parking and construction of a storage building behind LaPotosina Restaurant for Petitioner Jesus Gomez, moved to dispense with the readings and asked for approval. After hearing testimony during a Public Hearing on December 3, 2015, the Planning & Zoning Commission voted 7 to 0 with 2 absent to recommend approval. Alderman Strebing moved to concur with the recommendation and asked for approval, seconded by Alderman Foster. Alderman Strebing commented the plants and shrubbery are overgrown at the restaurant location and asked if City staff could look into that when plantings are done for the expansion. Mr. Hilleary noted Jesus Gomez has also filed a petition for an alley vacation near the Gilbert Street and Forrest Street area. Mayor Eisenhower presented the Annual Report of the Board of Trustees of the Police Pension Fund for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 for approval which stated an estimated amount of \$2,494,048.00 is required the next fiscal year to pay pensions and other obligations and to meet annual requirements of the Fund as provided by Statute. Mayor Eisenhower presented the Annual Report of the Board of Trustees of the Fire Pension Fund for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 for approval which stated an estimated amount of \$2,714,487.00 is required the next fiscal year to pay pensions and other obligations and to meet annual requirements of the Fund as provided by Statute. Mayor Eisenhauer thanked Comptroller Lewis for an excellent job on the tax levy and voiced appreciation to the City Council members for all of their hard work over the last several months on the tax levy and budget.

#14...APPROVAL OF ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017

Mayor Eisenhauer presented the 2016-2017 Budget totaling \$55,013,346.00 minus departmental transfers of \$9,201,091.00 for a grand total of \$45,812,255.00, for approval, beginning May 1, 2016 through April 30, 2017, as was presented and placed on public display December 1, 2015. Alderman Puhr moved to approve as presented, seconded by Alderman Strebing. Vice Mayor Williams voiced concern of spending \$3.3 million more than last year with \$1.1 million in pensions and two thirds in additional spending. He stated additional spending is not fair to the citizens as citizens are tightening their belts. He also is opposed to the Deputy Director of Patrol position in the Police Division. Mayor Eisenhauer stated the Aldermen were not approving the position with their vote on the budget. The funding is set aside in the budget for the position, but Aldermen will act on the position at a later time with a wage chart amendment. Alderman Hoskins questioned the pass through funds from the State and Mayor Eisenhauer responded the City is now receiving funds from the State for Video Gaming, State Use Tax, and Motor Fuel Tax which helps with the cash flow during the current fiscal year, but does not impact the budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 because the Administration anticipated the funds would be received prior to May 1, 2016. Alderman Pickering stated she will be voting “no” on the Budget. Alderman Davis stated he pays attention to citizens who regularly attend the Council and Committee meetings and really appreciated comments made by Mr. McClinden at the last Council

meeting. Alderman Brown stated she will not be supporting the budget as she is honoring her constituents. There being no further questions or discussion, the roll call vote being:
