

## A Good Neighbor...

- ...mows the yard. Keeping your yard mowed improves the appearance of the neighborhood and keeps weed seeds from spreading.
- ...picks up trash. Trash, garbage and improper outdoor storage is unsightly and is not appealing to visitors and other residents.
- ...keeps vehicles licensed, operable and parked on an approved surface. An inoperable vehicle makes an area appear rundown and unattractive which can affect property values. A vehicle should always be parked in a driveway, garage or the street, if allowed by ordinance.
- ...keeps the house and other buildings on the property well maintained. Painting and other regular maintenance also helps protect the home from structural damage as well as improving its value.
- ...most importantly maintains their property so it retains value as well as adding to the overall value of other properties in the neighborhood.

The City of Danville's Environmental Code Enforcement Program provides the requirements to ensure public health, safety, and welfare of its residents. The program is designed to help residents identify and correct violations which detract from the appearance of their home, neighborhood, and community. A clean, well kept city increases property values and enhances community pride.

1. **Uncut Grass Exceeding 6 Inches**
2. **Grass Clippings Blown into Street**
3. **Trash and Litter in Yard**
4. **Outdoor Storage: Appliances, Equipment and Building Materials**
5. **Weeds and Nuisance Vegetation**
6. **Tree Limbs and Brush on Property**
7. **Inoperable Vehicles**
8. **General Property Maintenance**
9. **Toters not Stored in Side or Rear Yard**
10. **Toters Set out Too Early or Left Out Too Late**
11. **House Address Numbers Missing**
12. **Vehicles Not Parked on Approved Surfaces**
13. **Dilapidated Garages and Out Buildings**
