A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING APPROVAL OF SIMULCAST RADIO SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Danville Public Building Commission (DPBC) operates, maintains and provides capital improvements for the 911 Communications Center and County-wide Radio System in accordance with a lease agreement with the City of Danville (City); and

WHEREAS, the City approved Resolution 2016-112 approving a Memorandum of Understanding with DPBC and the County of Vermilion (County) to outline the procedure to be followed, for and during, completion of the improvements and other capital projects, as outlined on the Project List, using bond funds held in escrow by DPBC; and

WHEREAS, the project cost to the Radio Conversion to Digital project as listed on the Bond Issue Project List has previously been amended from \$100,000 to \$161,316; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to additionally amend the project cost of the Radio Conversion to Digital project as listed on the Bond Issue Project List an additional \$279,039 in order to fund the installation of a simulcast radio system; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2019 DPBC held a Danville Public Building Commission Board meeting to authorize the installation of a simulcast radio system at twelve (12) sites within the County and five (5) sites within the City by Supreme Radio Communications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Danville that the City confirms the DPBC approval of the additionally amended project amount of \$324,842.35 in accordance with the provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding.

**AGREEMENT**

This Agreement (this “**Agreement**”) is entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_, by and between the **CITY OF DANVILLE**, an Illinois home rule municipal corporation (the “**Municipality**”), and **MARUTI GAGNAN MANAGEMENT, LLC** (the “**Owner**”).

**P R E A M B L E**

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality has the authority to promote health, safety and welfare, including to prevent the spread of blight and deterioration and inadequate public facilities by promoting the development of and private investment in industry, business and housing and enhancing the marketability of property, thereby increasing the tax base of the Municipality and reducing unemployment; and

**WHEREAS**, Owner desires to enter into an agreement for assistance regarding the dilapidated structures contained on the real property located at 829 E Main, 831 E. Main and 833 E. Main, Danville; and

**WHEREAS**, the Owner’s request for assistance is consistent with the Municipality’s goals of enhancing the marketability of property, increasing the tax base, and reducing blight, especially on the Main Street Corridor; and

**WHEREAS**, the Owner has requested certain assistance which is consistent with assistance the Municipality has provided to others within the community in order to remove blight within the City of Danville.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY AND THE OWNER, FOR GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE RECEIPT AND SUFFICIENCY OF WHICH IS HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGED**, agree as follows:

**1. OWNERSHIP**

Owner represents and warrants that it, or its successors or assigns, hold, and will hold, fee simple title to the Development Area.

**2. MUNICIPALITY’S OBLIGATIONS**

The Municipality shall demolish the structures located on the properties of 829 E. Main, 831 E. Main and 833 E. Main, Danville.

The Municipality shall remove all trees and brush located on the properties of 829 E. Main, 831 E. Main and 833 E. Main, Danville.

### 3. OWNER'S OBLIGATIONS

In consideration of the assistance from the Municipality described in Paragraph 2 above, Owner shall pay for asbestos removal from the structures located on 829 E. Main, 831 E. Main and 833 E. Main, Danville. Any such asbestos removal and payment of costs associated with removal shall be completed prior to the demolition of such structures.

In consideration of the assistance from the Municipality described in Paragraph 2 above, Owner shall pay all dump fees associated with the demolition of the structures located on 829 E. Main, 831 E. Main and 833 E. Main, Danville.

### 4. EVENTS OF DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

Material failure or delay by either the Municipality or Owner to timely perform any term or provision of this Agreement shall constitute an **“event of default”** under this Agreement. The party who so fails or delays must, upon receipt of written notice of the existence of such event of default, immediately commence to cure, correct or remedy such event of default and thereafter proceed with diligence to cure such event of default. The party claiming such event of default shall give written notice of the claimed event of default to the other party specifying the event of default complained of. Except as required to protect against immediate, irreparable harm, the party asserting an event of default may not institute proceedings against the other party until thirty (30) days after having given such notice. If such event of default is cured within such thirty (30) day period, the event of default shall not be deemed to constitute a **“default”** under this Agreement. If the event of default is one which cannot reasonably be cured within a thirty (30) day period, upon request and with appropriate showings the cure period shall be extended for such time as is reasonably necessary for the curing of the same, so long as there is diligent proceeding to cure such event of default. If such event of default is cured within such extended period, the event shall not be deemed to constitute a default under this Agreement.

Any event of default not cured as provided above shall constitute a default under this Agreement. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, any failure or delay by either party in asserting any of its rights or remedies as to any event of default or default shall not operate as a waiver of any such event of default or default of any rights or remedies it may have as a result of such event of default or default.

In the event of a default under any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement, the parties shall have all remedies with respect to this Agreement available under applicable law. With respect to any suit filed in circuit court, the remedies which may be sought shall include reasonable attorney's fees and costs of suit.

The obligations of the parties with respect to the terms of this Agreement are considered mutual obligations.

### 5. TIME; UNAVOIDABLE DELAY

Time is of the essence of this Agreement. Provided, however, the Owner shall not be deemed in default with respect to any obligations under this Agreement on its part to be performed if the Owner fails to timely perform the same and such failure is due in whole or in part to any strike, lock-out, labor trouble (whether legal or illegal), civil disorder, inability to

procure materials, weather conditions, wet soil conditions, failure or interruption of power, restrictive governmental laws and regulations, condemnation, riots, insurrections, war, fuel shortages, accidents, casualties, Acts of God, acts caused directly or indirectly by the Municipality (or the Municipality's agents or, employees) or third parties, or any other similar cause beyond the reasonable control of Owner, including but not limited to delays in acquiring interests in or possession of real estate caused by the parties who are contractually obligated to convey and grant to the Owner, for which the Owner shall have a day for day extension for any deadlines hereunder, if such event is claimed in writing delivered within ten (10) days of the occurrence of the claimed event giving rise thereto.

**6. ASSIGNMENT**

The rights and obligations of Owner under this Agreement shall be assignable, in whole and not in part, with (i) not less than 20 business days' (or such lesser notice acceptable to the Municipality) written notice by the Owner to the Municipality and (ii) the written approval of such assignment by the Municipality, including on such terms and conditions as the Municipality shall require; provided that no such assignment shall be deemed to release the Owner of its obligations to the Municipality under this Agreement unless the consent of the Municipality to the release of the Owner's obligations is first obtained. Such assignment by Owner shall not be unreasonably denied to any competent, reliable, and financially solvent developer proposed by Owner as the assignee.

**7. WAIVER**

Any party to this Agreement may elect to waive any remedy it may have hereunder, provided that no such waiver shall be deemed to exist unless the party waiving such right or remedy does so in writing. No such waiver shall obligate such party to waive any other right or remedy hereunder, or shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of other rights and remedies provided pursuant to this Agreement.

**8. SEVERABILITY**

If any section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any party or circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of such section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application of same to parties or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby.

**9. NOTICES**

All notices, demands, requests, consents, approvals or other instruments required or permitted by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be executed by the party or an officer, agent or attorney of the party, and shall be deemed to have been effective as of the date of actual delivery, if delivered personally, or as of the third (3rd) day from and including the date of posting, if mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid, addressed as follows (or to such other address as is provided by notice):

Neither anything in this Agreement nor any acts of the Municipality and/or the Owner under this Agreement shall be construed by the parties or any third person to create the relationship of a partnership, agency, or joint venture between them. No covenant or agreement contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to be the covenant or agreement of any official, officer, agent, employee or attorney of the Municipality, in his or her individual capacity, and neither the members of the Corporate Authorities nor any other official or employee of the Municipality shall be liable personally under this Agreement or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of or in connection with or arising out of the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement, or any failure in that connection.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 34  
OF THE CITY CODE PERTAINING TO POLICE DEPARTMENT**

WHEREAS, Chapter 34 contains provisions regarding the operation of the Police Department;  
and,

WHEREAS, certain aspects of the organization and operation of the Police Department have  
changed; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 34 should be amended to ensure that it is consistent with the current  
organization and operation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Danville, Illinois as  
follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 34 shall be amended as follows, with strikethroughs being deletions and  
underlining being additions:

**§ 34.01 ESTABLISHMENT.**

There is hereby established as a department of the municipal government of the city a police  
department, which shall manage and effectuate the duties and functions assigned to it by ordinance and  
all law enforcement functions of the city. The executive officer of the department shall be the chief of  
police, who shall be an officer of the city appointed by the mayor with the approval of the city council,  
and who shall report to the mayor. The chief of police shall inform the mayor and the city council as to  
the business and affairs of the police department and shall manage the personnel of the department.  
(Ord. 7792, passed 11-7-95)

**§ 34.02 RESERVED.**

**§ 34.03 EXECUTIVE OFFICER.**

The executive officer of the police department shall be the Chief of Police ~~director of public safety~~.  
~~All references in this code of ordinances to the chief of police or the police chief shall be deemed to~~  
~~mean the director of public safety. The office of the chief of police is hereby abolished.~~

**§ 34.04 POLICE DEPARTMENT COMMAND STRUCTURE.**

(A) The command structure of the police department shall consist of the following ranks in order  
from superior to inferior:

- Police Chief
- ~~Director of public safety~~
- ~~Deputy director(s) of police~~
- Commander(s)
- Sergeant(s)

~~The director of public safety and deputy director(s) of police shall be officers~~ Police Chief shall be an officer of the city appointed by the mayor with the advice and consent of the city council. ~~The deputy director(s) of police shall be non-union management executives of the police department who shall report to the director of public safety and shall perform such duties and functions as assigned by statute, ordinance and the director.~~

(B) There is created the office of commander of police, who shall be appointed by the board of fire and police commissioners. The commander(s) shall report to the Police Chief ~~deputy director(s) of police~~ and shall perform such duties and functions as assigned by statute, ordinance, and the Police Chief superior command personnel.

(C) There is created the office of sergeant of police, who shall be appointed by the board of fire and police commissioners. The sergeant(s) shall report to the commander(s), ~~or if none to the deputy director(s) of police~~ and shall perform such duties and functions as assigned by statute, ordinance, and superior command personnel.

~~(D) The former rank of lieutenant is hereby retained until such time as the initial two deputy directors of police have retired or otherwise voluntarily terminated or have died. At that time, the rank of lieutenant is abolished.~~

#### **§ 34.05 POLICE OFFICERS.**

(A) The offices of policeman, patrolman, and police matron are abolished and there is created the office of police officer within the city. ~~All present police officers, patrolmen, and police matrons are appointed as police officers.~~

(B) ~~There shall be no more than 56 police officers and all future~~ appointments of police officers shall be made by the board of fire and police commissioners.

(C) The police officers, as well as the chief of police and all other officers, when on duty shall devote their entire time and attention to the discharge of the duties of their office. They shall observe all rules and regulations of the department as set up by the duly constituted authorities. They shall, to the best of their ability, preserve order, quiet, and peace throughout the city and shall enforce the laws of the state and ordinances of the city. ~~They shall report to the chief all persons known or suspected of being gamblers, and all hours of places suspected of being gaming houses, houses of ill fame, and the like. When any police officer has knowledge that an offense has been committed, he shall make a complaint and subpoena proper witnesses and procure evidence for the successful prosecution of the offender.~~ ('64 Code, § 25-10; amend. Ord. 5311, passed 12-14-65; amend. Ord. 5680, passed 1-27-70; amend. Ord. 5981, passed 11-7-72; amend. Ord. 6305, passed 3-16-76)

#### **§ 34.06 REMOVAL.**

(A) Any officer or member of the police department, except the chief of police, who shall be removed by the city council, may be removed by the board of fire and police commissioners for violation of any lawfully promulgated rules. The officer or member may, in any event, be removed for:

- (1) Disobedience of the orders of his superiors.
- (2) Intoxication.
- (3) Violent, insolent, or abusive language to any superior officer or to any citizen, resident, or stranger.

(4) Drinking intoxicating liquor when on duty or coming on duty while partially under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

(5) Conduct on or off duty unbecoming a member of the department or detrimental to the best interests of the city.

(6) Absence from duty without leave.

(7) Inefficiency.

(8) Lack of good physical or mental condition.

(B) The officer or member shall be removed from office by the board of fire and police commissioners for any of the following actions:

(1) Participating in, causing, inducing, or encouraging any strike or other concerted withholding of services by any officer or member of the police department.

### **§ 34.07 POWER TO ARREST.**

(A) A police officer may arrest a person when:

(1) He or she has a warrant commanding that such person be arrested;

(3) He or she has reasonable grounds to believe that the person is committing or has committed an offense.

(B) Whenever a police officer arrests a person, the officer shall question the arrestee as to whether he or she has any children under the age of 18 living with him or her who may be neglected as a result of the arrest or otherwise. The police officer shall assist the arrestee in the placement of the children with a relative or other responsible person designated by the arrestee. If the police officer has reasonable cause to believe that a child may be a neglected child as defined in the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act, he or she shall report it immediately to the Department of Children and Family Services as provided in that Act.

(C) A police officer who executes a warrant of arrest in good faith beyond the geographical limitation of the warrant shall not be liable for false arrest. ('64 Code, § 25-14) (Ord. 8524, passed 1-2-07)

However, a Police Officer or Veterinarian may perform euthanasia in emergency situations when delay would cause the animal undue pain and suffering.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully or maliciously taunt, torment, tease, beat, strike, or administer or subject to any desensitizing drugs, chemicals or substances to any animal used by a Law Enforcement Officer in the performance of the functions or duties of the Police Department, or when placed in confinement off duty; or to interfere or meddle with any such animal used by the Police Department or any handler thereof in the performance of the functions or duties of the Department.

(C) Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,500.

(D) In addition to any fine imposed pursuant to this section, the offender shall be ordered to pay the following:

(1) All of the costs and fees incurred by the city in prosecuting the violation, which shall include but not be limited to the costs associated with an administrative adjudication proceeding or court proceeding, and reasonable attorney's fees; and

(2) Restitution in an amount not to exceed the actual loss or damage to the dog and pecuniary loss.

### **§ 34.20 DUTY TO DELIVER TO CHIEF OF POLICE.**

Whenever any bicycle or other chattel, except a motor vehicle, which has been abandoned, lost, stolen, or unclaimed shall come into the possession or custody of any person in the city who does not know the identity of the owner or other person legally entitled to possession, the person shall without delay deliver the bicycle or other chattel to the chief of police.

### **§ 34.21 DUTIES OF CHIEF OF POLICE ON RECEIPT OF THE PROPERTY.**

(A) Property believed to be abandoned, lost, stolen, or otherwise illegally possessed shall be retained in custody by the chief of police or other principal official of the law enforcement agency. He shall make reasonable inquiry and efforts to identify and notify the owner or other person entitled to possession and shall return the property after the person provides reasonable and satisfactory proof of his ownership or right to possession and reimburses the agency for all reasonable expenses of custody.

(B) If the identity or location of the owner or person entitled to possession of the property has not been ascertained within 6 months after the police department or other law enforcement agency obtains possession, the chief of police or other principal official shall effectuate the sale of the property for cash to the highest bidder at a public auction. Notice of the sale, including time, place, and a brief description of the property, shall be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the official has authority. The notice shall be published at least 10 days prior to the auction. Property offered but not sold at the public auction may be offered and sold at the subsequent public auction without notice.

### **§ 34.22 REDEMPTION OF PROPERTY.**

(B) ~~An auxiliary police officer shall be a resident of the city.~~ Prior to the appointment of any auxiliary police officer, his fingerprints shall be taken, and an examination made of the fingerprints. No person shall be appointed as an auxiliary police officer if he has been convicted of a felony or other crime involving moral turpitude.

(C) The term of the appointment shall not exceed one calendar year from the date of appointment. (Ord. 5550, passed 10-8-68; amend. Ord. 7170, passed 2-28-86; amend. Ord. 8513, passed 12-5-06)

### § 34.31 DUTIES.

(A) Auxiliary police officers shall not supplement members of the regular police department of the city in the performance of their assigned and normal duties except as provided in this section.

(B) Auxiliary police officers shall only be assigned to perform the following duties:

- (1) To aid or direct traffic within the municipality.
- (2) To aid in the control of natural or man-made disasters.
- (3) To aid, in case of civil disorder, as directed by the chief of police.
- (4) Other non-enforcement duties as may be assigned by the chief of police ~~Director~~.

(C) Auxiliary police officers shall not be conservators of the peace. (Ord. 5550, passed 10-8-68; Am. Ord. 8513, passed 12-5-06)

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 103  
OF THE CITY CODE PERTAINING TO PUBLIC NUISANCE MOTOR VEHICLES**

WHEREAS, Chapter 103 provides for the seizure and impoundment of motor vehicles used in the commission of certain offenses; and,

WHEREAS, the penalty provision of Chapter 103 was designed to prevent repeat offenders; and,

WHEREAS, the penalty provision has resulted in an increase in the abandonment of impounded motor vehicles with the towing companies; and,

WHEREAS, the penalty provision should be amended to reduce the amount of abandoned vehicles but still provide a deterrent to the use of motor vehicles in the commission of certain offenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Danville, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 103 shall be amended as follows, with underlining being additions and strikethroughs being deletions:

**§ 103.01 PUBLIC NUISANCE.**

(A) A motor vehicle which is used in the commission of or in conjunction with the commission of any of the offenses described herein shall be declared a public nuisance and shall be subject to seizure and impoundment pursuant to this chapter:

(1) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits an act of prostitution or solicitation for prostitution in violation of the Illinois Criminal Code, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, §§ 11-14 or 11-15, or §§ 135.04 or 135.05 of the Danville City Code.

(2) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits the offense of illegal dumping, in violation of § 93.06 of the Danville City Code.

(3) The driver of the motor vehicle, while being under the age of 21, is in possession of or has consumed an alcoholic beverage in violation of the Illinois Liquor Control Act, ILCS Ch. 235, Act 5, § 6-20, or § 96.32 of the Danville City Code.

(4) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Criminal Code, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 646, being the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act.

(5) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Criminal Code, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 24-1.5 entitled "Reckless Discharge of a Firearm".

(6) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Cannabis Control Act, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 550, §§ 1 et seq., or Chapter 140 of the Danville City Code, and the weight of the substance is ~~2.5~~ 30 grams or greater.

(7) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 570, § 100 et seq.

(8) The driver or any other person within the motor vehicle commits any act of vandalism or criminal damage to property in violation of § [132.40](#) or § [132.51](#) of the City Code or any similar provision under state law and only where the vandalism or criminal damage results in injury to a person or damage to property.

(9) The driver or any other person in possession of a motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code, ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 12-611, entitled "Sound Amplification Systems," or § [101.01](#) of the Danville City Code regarding noise.

(10) The driver or other person in control of a motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, §§ 6-101 et seq. by driving the motor vehicle without a valid driver's license or permit or ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, §§ 6-201 et seq., by operating the vehicle with a cancelled, suspended or revoked driver's license, or § [70.033](#) of the City Code.

(11) The driver or other person in control of the motor vehicle commits a violation of § [70.008](#) of the Danville Code or the Illinois Vehicle Code, ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-204, being Fleeing or Eluding a Police Officer, or the Illinois Vehicle Code, ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5 § 11-204.1, being Aggravated Fleeing or Eluding a Police Officer.

(12) The driver or other person within the motor vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Drug Paraphernalia Control Act, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 600 § 1 et seq. and [Chapter 139](#) of the Danville City Code, pertaining to possession of drug paraphernalia.

(13) The driver of the vehicle commits a violation of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code, ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5 § 11-501, entitled Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, Other Drug or Drugs, Intoxicating Compound or Compounds or Any Combination Thereof.

(B) The penalties provided in this chapter shall be in addition to any penalties which may be imposed against the driver or other persons within the motor vehicle pursuant to any other City ordinance or state law.

(C) The term "motor vehicle" as used in this chapter shall have the same meaning as set forth in § [70.001](#) of the City Code. In addition, the term "motor vehicle" as used in this chapter shall include motorcycles, motor-driven cycles, and motorized pedalcycles, as defined in § [70.001](#) of the City Code.

### **§ 103.08 PENALTIES.**

(A) Whenever a motor vehicle is used in the commission of or in conjunction with any of the offenses described in § [103.01](#)(A), the motor vehicle may be impounded and the owner of record of the motor vehicle shall be liable for an administrative penalty. The administrative penalty shall be in the amount of ~~\$500~~[300](#). The penalty shall be imposed upon the owner regardless of whether subsequent offenses involve different motor vehicles. In addition to the administrative penalty imposed herein, the owner of record shall be responsible for all applicable towing and storage fees.

(B) Costs. In addition to any fine or other penalty imposed pursuant to this chapter, the owner of record shall be ordered to pay the costs and fees incurred by the City in prosecuting the violation, which shall include, but not be limited to, the costs associated with an administrative adjudication proceeding or court proceeding, and reasonable attorney's fees.

(C) If a penalty is imposed pursuant to this chapter, such penalty shall constitute a debt due and owing to the City. The owner of record's obligation to pay such debt to the City shall be independent of the City's return of any impounded motor vehicle. If a bond has been posted, the Hearing Officer shall enter an order deducting any penalty imposed pursuant to this chapter from the bond so posted.

(D) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, an impounded motor vehicle shall be returned to the owner of record, or other person who is legally entitled to possess the motor vehicle, upon his or her

payment to the City of the penalty or penalties imposed pursuant to this chapter, including the towing and storage fees, unless the motor vehicle has been sold or otherwise disposed of to satisfy a judgment or enforce a lien as provided by law.

(E) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, whenever a person with a lien of record against a motor vehicle impounded under this chapter has commenced foreclosure or repossession proceedings, possession of the motor vehicle shall be given to that person, but only upon agreeing, in writing, to refund to the City the net proceeds of any sale of the motor vehicle less any amounts necessary to pay all lien holders of record, up to the total amount of penalties imposed pursuant to this chapter which are outstanding.

SECTION 2: This amendatory Ordinance shall be effective ten (10) days after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form.
